

Motcombe School Pupil Premium Report 2018 - 2019

Context of School

The pupil premium is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers. Data is collected termly for Reading, Writing and Maths in KS1 and termly Pupil Progress meetings are held by the Senior Leadership Team, including separate meetings for Vulnerable and Disadvantaged learners.

At Motcombe School we are committed to ensuring that our children are given every chance to reach their full potential and Pupil Premium funding is spent to maximum effect.

Our belief:

Objectives and Evaluation of Pupil Premium Spending

Our key objective in using the Pupil premium funding is to narrow the gap between pupil groups. As a school we have a commitment to ensuring that pupils make good progress, but historically levels of attainment have been lower for children eligible for Free School Meals – this is also a national trend and the reason that the Government has identified this as a priority and funded accordingly. Through targeted interventions we are working to eliminate barriers to learning and progress. For children who start school with low attainment, our aim is to ensure that they make accelerated progress in order to reach at least age related expectations as they move through the school.

The school's evaluation of its own performance comprises the following:

- 6 data capture points per year in both Foundation Stage and KS1 for Reading, Writing and Maths
- Assessments are moderated to ensure they are accurate including external moderation
- The school uses Target Tracker to track progress of individual pupils and data is recorded on this tracking system 6 times per year
- Tracking of progress over time for each child can quickly identify any dips and develop sensible strategies to promote improvement.
- Pupil Progress meetings held six times a year identify children who are vulnerable to underachievement. As part of the Pupil Progress meetings week the school undertakes a separate Vulnerable Pupils Progress meeting with key staff and a Governor who is our Pupil Premium Champion.
- Interventions are evaluated and future plans made taking account of AFL over the previous term and Pupil Premium Teachers contribute to this
- 6 Governors Standards and Inclusion meetings per year
- Pupil Premium Governor reports to the Full Governing Body
- Headteacher works with a Pupil Forum (membership is exclusively children eligible for Pupil premium funding) each term to discuss progress through a Childrens Development Plan that the Forum has put together

Ambition for the School:

- Every child will leave Foundation Stage as a confident speaker
- Every child will leave Y1 as a confident reader
- Every child will leave Y2 as a confident writer
