Our Foundation Stage children have settled in beautifully! Look out for their class photos in the Herald newspaper's First Class feature on 31 October!




Thank you for all the donations for the Foodbank this week. The School Council has been to the Foodbank depot this afternoon and have learned what happens to the food that is donated.

**School Lunch –** The new Autumn/Winter menu is being emailed to you today with the newsletter. You can also access it on our website – <u>Autumn/Winter menu</u>.

If your child has a special diet menu, this has been emailed to you recently.

**Free School Meals (Pupil Premium)** – All infant school children receive a school lunch for free, however, some families are entitled to free school meals (Pupil Premium). If your child is entitled, school will receive funding to provide additional support/resources where required. School will also contribute towards the cost of school trips etc. It will also be beneficial for when your child leaves Motcombe to go to junior school as that is when you start paying for their school lunches.

Please see the criteria below click this link to check eligibility - Apply for Free School Meals.

- <u>Universal Credit GOV.UK</u> if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- Income Support GOV.UK
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA) GOV.UK
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA) GOV.UK
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 GOV.UK

- The Guaranteed element of State Pension Credit -GOV.UK
- <u>Child Tax Credit GOV.UK</u>, only, if your annual household income (assessed by HM Revenue & Customs) isn't over £16,190.

[Anyone who gets Working Tax Credit - GOV.UK, won't get free meals regardless of income]

• Working Tax Credit run-on – paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.
