

Motcombe Infant School Sports Funding Report 2021 - 2022

What is the Sports Premium?

Schools with primary-age pupils receive the PE and sport premium in the academic year 2018 to 2019. The premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, in the 2018 to 2019 academic year, to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. Information on how much PE and sport premium funding primary schools receive and advice on how to spend it has been published

Purpose of the funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Our Objectives

At Motcombe, we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. We believe that a varied PE curriculum has a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children.

Our Primary School Sport's Funding will enable us to continue and extend our provision. We will also use the funding to train our staff to deliver improved PE sessions.

Strengths identified

- PE Subject Leader is experienced
- Vision for PE is secure (See PE Policy)
- Youth Sports Trust self-evaluation tool demonstrates that all 9 of the objectives are either established or embedded
- Staff view PE, activity and healthy lifestyle as central to school.
- Pupils are engaged and motivated in PE and healthy activities.
- Pupils undertake the daily run or daily exercises

Areas of Development

- Staff have a wide range of experiences and expertise but overall wish to develop their confidence in teaching PE.
- Measurement of pupil progress in physical development and skills needs to be developed.

The school has decided to spend the money in the following way:

- Extra PE training for teachers – 1 day per week (April to July – 10 days in total)
- New scooters and helmets
- New footballs, rugby balls and Sports Day medals
- Playground equipment
- Ratton School PE provision
- Sports Zone MDSA and 2 extra hours for Sports TA for planning
- Tyre park
- Ne PE scheme of work

Action	Cost	Proposed Outcomes	Impact
Sports Zone MDSA	£4,639	Improved quality PE to include lunchtimes	The lunchtime football sessions were very popular and children learnt the basic rules of football as well as working as a team.
Extra PE training for teachers including a dance workshop and new PE scheme	£6,430	Improved PE teaching	Dance sessions improved the quality of dance for the end of year shows for all year groups.
Purchase new equipment	£898.79	Improved equipment for the children to use	Renewed enthusiasm for playground choices
Purchase Ratton School PE provision	£1,500	Children had access to sports tournaments throughout the year	Children were exposed to different sports and particularly enjoyed trampoline sessions
Purchase a tyre park	£8,250	Children to improve balance which will strengthen core muscles	Hugely popular – children are very keen to use the tyre park.
